

Description

This course introduces students to expectations and requirements that address professional practice and registration as an Architect. The realities of involvement and challenges associated with the practice of architecture and realising architectural projects are critically examined through topics that address ethical, contractual, legal and business responsibilities, project procurement, global practice as well as career planning and pathways.

Aims

To satisfy the professional accrediation requirements in the Professional Practice Stream for the Master of Architecture.

This course prepares students to consider professional requirements for registration and practice as an architect in specific jurisdictions in Australia.

It will also examine the production of architecture as a social event and will analyse a series of explanations of the relationships between society and space and will look at both Asian and Western cultures as examples.
